



Discovering Easter Island - 4 Days / 3 Nights



Day 01:

Visitors will receive an authentic Easter Island welcome at the airport with flower necklaces. Transfer to the hotels.

Day 02: Rano Raraku, North Coast and Anakena Beach

9am: This excursion will visit the different archeological areas on the island, allowing visitors to get to know where the Rapa Nui culture comes from. It will go along the coast, visiting Ahu Akahanga, Volcano Rano Raraku and its surrounding area. These hillsides are where the majority of the Moais were sculptured and where most of them remain. The tour will visit Ahu Tongariki, the main platform on the island, home to 15 renovated statues. Continuing past the Poike peninsula to the north coast, it will stop at Ahu Te Pito Kura, a place holding the largest statue outside of the quarry. The tour will arrive at Anakena beach, – an old residential area for royalty – with its warm turquoise waters, white sand, palm trees and set of Moais called Ahu Nau Nau. This is one of the most beautiful landscapes on the whole island. In the afternoon, the tour will return, passing the small town of Hanga Roa to take the road that crosses the centre of the island. Arrive back at hotel. This excursion includes a picnic.

Day 03: Rano Kau, Orongo and Ahu Vinapu

9:00am: The excursion begins by winding its way up the side of Rano Kao Volcano, arriving at the viewpoint looking over the crater. Inside it contains a number of lakes and large amount vegetation. Following this, it will visit the small ceremonial town of Orongo, which is built on the Cliffside and is where the annual elections took place. All of the Island's clans would gather together in various stone houses in the spring to wait on the arrival of the sacred bird (Manutara). This would then lead to the election of the man-bird – the Tangata Manu. The tour will continue to the Vinapu area, formally called Ahu, containing a wall with enormous stone blocks that fit together perfectly. Return to the hotel.





Akivi, Puna Pau and Uri a Urenga

3pm: Leave from the hotel and head to the centre of the Island, arriving at a platform that shows off the Ahu Akivi, 7 Moai statues. These Moai represent both the legend of the Rapa Nui culture, as well as the Polynesian town on this island. The statues here are facing the sea, a rarity amongst the hundreds of Moai that were built. After this, the tour will continue towards Uri a Urenga, a Moai that was renovated by William Mulloy in 1976. This platform, 13m in length and 4m wide contains a strange Moai that has been made with two pairs of hands. The tour will visit the Puna Pau quarry, a small hill from which the red stone headdresses were taken to crown the Moai. Here there is a viewpoint that overlooks the town of Hanga Roa and its green surroundings. Return to the hotel.

Day 04:

Transfer from the hotel to the airport, leave with a typical farewell – shell necklaces.
